Masters of Social Work Fellowship: provides need-based scholarships to incoming MSW students who strongly align with the MSW Program Mission.	Incoming MSW students
Excellence in Social Impact Scholarship: provides need-based scholarships to incoming and continuing MSW students who strongly align with the MSW Program Mission.	Incoming and continuing MSW students
Extended Degree Program Fellowship: provides financial assistance to MSW students in the Extended Degree Program.	Incoming and continuing MSW EDP students
Audie Lemke Endowed Fellowship: provides financial assistance to MSW students whose selected course of study demonstrates a commitment to promoting the health and welfare of gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgendered, and questioning individuals, including prevention research focusing on sexually transmitted diseases such as HIV/AIDS.	Continuing MSW students and incoming Advanced Standing students
Katherine M. Rickey Fellowship: provides financial assistance to MSW students who have an interest in health policy.	Continuing MSW students and incoming Advanced Standing students
Etnyre Lonesome Endowed Scholarship Fund: supports MSW students that have strong commitment to social justice and interest in serving, through direct-practice or research, underserved and marginalized populations, especially those with severe mental-illness. Farber Memorial Endowed Fund: provides financial assistance to MSW students whose work best exemplifies innovative social work practice, and demonstrates a commitment to improving the health and welfare of individuals and/or communities. Libby DeLong Endowed Fellowship: provides financial assistance for students dedicated to serving disadvantaged communities of color.	Continuing EDP students
Rizzo and Gonzalez Family Endowed Fellowship: provides financial assistance for students dedicated to studying domestic/interpersonal violence.	Continuing MSW students and incoming Advanced Standing students
Daniel J. & Clare LaFond Distinguished Endowed Fellowship: supports economically disadvantaged, under-represented, and marginalized members of society in their pursuit of higher education.	Continuing MSW students and incoming Advanced Standing students with a 3.5+ GPA
Kopp Scholarship: provides support to MSW students on the basis of academic merit and financial need, and is focused on those students wishing to combine traditional healing methods with professional social work who have committed to work in Native American communities.	Incoming and continuing MSW students
Don & Sylvia Schmid American Indian Child Welfare Leadership Endowed Fund: provides assistance to MSW students with an intended career in a child welfare setting, serving primarily American Indian communities, both on the reservation and in the urban areas.	Incoming and continuing MSW students
Vickie L. Sears Endowed Scholarship: provides support to MSW students on the basis of academic merit and financial need, with preference given to students who demonstrate a commitment to work with Indigenous communities.	Incoming and continuing MSW students
International Student Tuition Waiver: supports exceptional international students entering the MSW Program. Students are nominated by the School of Social Work and funding is distributed through the Graduate School. Note that all students who completed the Funding Consideration Form are considered for nomination.	Incoming international MSW students
Office of Graduate Student Equity & Excellence Graduate Tuition and/or Graduate Supplemental Awards: provides financial assistance to students with exceptional merit, need, and diversity. Students are nominated by the School of Social Work and funding is distributed through GSEE. Note that all students who completed the Funding Consideration Form are considered for nomination.
